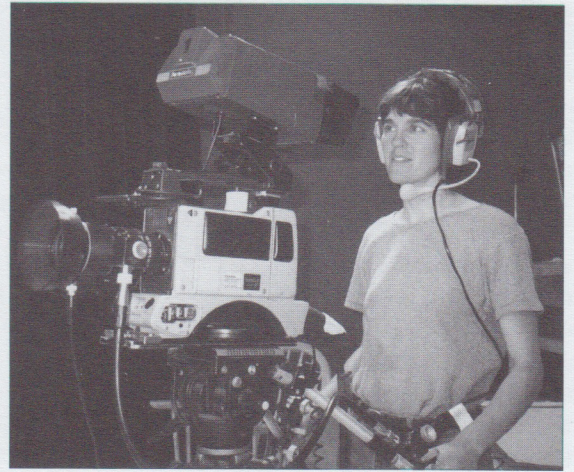
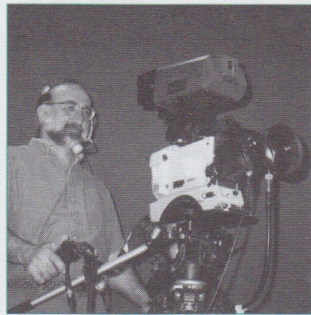

CONCORD COMMUNITY TV — THE FIRST TWO YEARS

THE PAST

In September of 1991 a group of volunteer community producers began broadcasting programs on Concord's public access channel (then Ch. 48). When Continental Cablevision closed its studio at the end of 1995, the group of producers—who had dubbed themselves C.A.C.T.US (Concord Area Community TV is Us)—continued intermittent programming despite this major setback. C.A.C.T.US members met with City officials and School Board members to discuss Concord developing its own access center. Years of discussion, consulting, research and advisory committee work finally bore fruit in 1998.

Concord Community TV (CCTV) was officially born on October 29, 1998 when the founding Board of Directors, chaired by Rose Marie Lanier, voted to incorporate as a nonprofit organization to run Concord's cable access center.

A three-way contract was signed on January 27, 1999 between the City, Concord School District, and CCTV covering three fiscal years: 1999, 2000 and 2001. Concord School District provides studio space at Concord High School. The City provides funds from the cable franchise fee, and a volunteer board of directors oversees the operation of CCTV. In 2001 that three-way contract will be renegotiated.

In May, 1999, Rick Watrous was hired part-time to organize the new TV studio into a fully functional access center and to complete the IRS filing for 501 (c)(3) charitable nonprofit status, granted on Aug. 3, 1999. That September, Watrous became full-time executive director.

THE PRESENT

CCTV began with used video equipment donated from the City. We have phased out the original 3/4" video playback equipment, which was obsolete and failing, and replaced it with VHS and SVHS equipment. Our production strength comes from our studio at Concord High School, where we have four professional video cameras and a state-of-the-art (newly donated!) lighting set-up.

Since September, 1999, CCTV has aired a minimum of 12 hours of non-commercial programming a day on the public access channel, Channel 22. A digital character generator fills the off-hours. Channel 6, the education channel, shows programs produced by students and teachers in the Concord School District, as well as satellite programming from MCET and Classic Arts Showcase. Channel 17, the government channel, displays a community bulletin board.

At first CCTV relied on tapes from outside the community to fill gaps in the public access schedule. Now, during most weeks, all of CCTV programming is produced by and for Concord residents. The list of volunteer community producers keeps growing. There is an increasing range of programming: talk shows, musical acts, lectures, sports, City Council meetings, and special events of all kinds. Our continuing shows run the gamut from "KidSpeakNH" with the Ballard family bringing on notable youngsters to "Concord Profiles" hosted by City Manager, Duncan Ballantyne.

To meet the growing demands of public access productions, Jennifer Gurksnis was hired as production coordinator in July 2000. The studio became an even busier place. On June 30, 2000 a total of 209 people had volunteered 1482 hours in our studio. By the end of 2000 those numbers had risen to 433 volunteers and 2620 hours. That's a lot of people donating a lot of their precious time to CCTV.

THE FUTURE

We have come a long way in our first two years, but there is much more to come. We look forward to a time when Concord Community TV is recognized and respected in the city as a valuable and easily accessible resource for all citizens. We will work to involve more individuals and organizations, so that CCTV will be seen as a way for residents to be informed, entertained, and connected with each other. We want to continue building Concord Community TV to serve, reflect and enhance our community.

MILESTONES

- ◆ Since Oct. of 1999 we have produced over 300 shows, mostly in the CCTV studio. The rest were taped at events around Concord.
- ◆ We now have 10 continuing weekly programs on the public access channel.
- ◆ 95% of our public access programming is produced locally.
- ◆ 71 people have taken our Studio Production course.
- ◆ 433 people have volunteered their time at CCTV.
- ◆ A total of 2,620 hours have been donated by those volunteers.
- ◆ CCTV helped raise over \$100,000 for the Concord Boys and Girls Club by producing their live-TV auctions in 1999 and 2000.
