To provide residents, city government and educational and nonprofit organizations of Concord, New Hampshire, and such surrounding towns that may elect to participate, with the opportunity, facilities and access to cable television for the purpose of producing and cablecasting public interest, cultural, education and government programs over the local cable television channels.

From the Board Chair

CCTV covers many aspects of Concord's youth and diverse culture.

Athletes of all ages are seen year-round starting in Summer with Little League and softball championships, Quarry Dog baseball and then seasonal high school sports. Concord is primarily a hockey town, thanks in a big part to Concord Youth Hockey celebrating its 50th birthday in 2007. Back in the late 1800's, Canadian ice hockey came to St. Paul's School and Concord. French Canadians settled in the area bringing their language and culture along with generations of hockey heroes.

Sports continue to provide the opportunity for young athletes of all backgrounds to play as teammates and excel. Concord athletes together have shared many competitions and championship seasons, but most importantly formed lifelong friendships, a cornerstone of Concord's community spirit.

Concord's 21st Century diversity is on its soccer fields, where players of international heritage display their talents. In 2005, Concord High's boys soccer team, with this diverse mix, won its first ever championship, and CCTV was there to record and preserve those memories.


City schools with student theater, music and arts performances are seen on CCTV. With assistance from principals and teachers, Concord students videotape these events for replay on the educational access channel. You can watch your children, grandchildren, or the neighborhood kids as they perform adding to Concord's cultural life. These student videographers and producers will become the CCTV of tomorrow, with maybe one of them becoming the next Ken Burns. All this is seen on the Education Channel 6.

Finally, on March 26, 2006, the arts reigned supreme with CCTV's Second Annual Arts Telefest. Numerous performances and presentations from Concord's arts community were showcased. Writers, musicians, artists, and performers alike paraded their talents and works during a twelve-hour broadcast marathon. Youth, and adults together sang, danced and performed in a cavalcade of stars in a continuous video quilt of Concord's arts and cultural community.

As always, CCTV broadcasts will reflect Concord's culture, youth and diversity with its sports and arts performance.






